

Eligibility

- Be eligible for Medical Assistance
- For CAC/CADI/BI: Be certified disabled by the Social Security Administration or State Medical Review Team (SMRT) process.
- For DD: Have a documented diagnosis of developmental disability or related condition.
- Be under the age of 65 at the time they are authorized to receive waiver.
- Be assessed through a screening process to need the level of care for: Hospital (CAC), Nursing Facility (CADI), Spec. Nursing Facility or neurobehavioral hospital (BI), or ICF/DD (DD).
- Have an assessed need for supports and services beyond those available through standard Medical Assistance (MA) benefit set.

How do people apply?

People who are interested in the following services should contact Red Lake County Social Services to ask for a screening or additional information.

CAC

Community Alternative Care (CAC)

Waiver: Home and community-based services necessary as an alternative to institutional that promote the optimal health, independence, safety and integration of a person who is chronically ill or medically fragile and who would otherwise require the level of care provided in a hospital.

BI

Brain Injury (BI) Waiver: Home and Community Based services necessary as an alternative to institutionalization that promote the optimal health, independence, safety and integration of a person who would otherwise require level of care provided in a specialized nursing facility or neurobehavioral hospital.

DD

Developmental Disability (DD)

Waiver: Home and community-based services necessary as an alternative to institutional that promote the optimal health, independence, safety and integration of a person who would otherwise require the level of care provided in an Intermediate Care Facility for Persons with Developmental Disabilities.

CADI

Community Alternatives for Disabled Individuals (CADI) Waiver:

Home and community-based services necessary as an alternative to institutional that promote the optimal health, independence, safety and integration of a person who would otherwise require the level of care provided in a nursing facility.

What is Case Management/Service Coordination?

A Service that assists persons on a waiver to access needed waiver and State plan services, as well as needed medical, social, educational and other services, regardless of the funding source.
